one of the largest gatherings of all things Norwegian in the region and is free to all and open to the public.

Nålbinding is an ancient textile technique to create fabric with a single needle and short lengths of yarn.

Predating knitting, the process forms interlocking loops for durable, warm and flexible items such as mittens, socks and hats. Nålbinding pulls the entire thread through each loop. It is often incorporated into Viking and medieval crafts.

Sámi National Day is celebrated annually on Feb. 6 across Scandinavia to commemorate the first international Sámi assembly, held in Trondheim, Norway, in 1917.

Many Norwegians and Norwegian-Americans are of full or partial Sámi descent. Sámi are an indigenous and nomadic people with traditional territories within the national borders of Finland, Norway, Sweden and Russia. Today, many Sámi have urbanized but large numbers live in the traditional villages and continue to practice long-standing vocations such as reindeer herding.

Local observances include the Sami Film Festival on Feb. 6 and 7 at Majestic Bay Theatres in Ballard.





## Library Corner by Marlis Pehling, Librarian

The newest wonderful book we have in our library is “The Five People You Meet in Heaven,” by Mitch Albom. It is a story about a war veteran named Eddie, who feels trapped in a meaningless life of fixing rides at a seaside amusement park.

He has become embittered in his old age, and, on his 83 birthday, he dies in a tragic accident saving a small girl from a falling cart. In his final breath he feels two small hands in his and then nothing.



Eddie awakens in the afterlife, where he learns that heaven is not the Garden of Eden he thought.

Rather, it is a place where your life is explained to you by five people — loved ones and strangers — who were connected to your life in some manner. Each one of these people illustrates and explains how Eddie had a profound impact on others and changed each person’s life path.

The stories illuminate how Eddie’s life was more connected than he had grown to believe and there was a purpose to it.

In the end, the reader discovers a haunting story from Eddie’s past and how he sought redemption in the last unknown act of his life. Enjoy this inspirational book!

# Team Norway Headed to Winter Olympics

**W**ith the Milano Cortina 2026 Winter Olympics just around the corner, Norway is poised to add to its significant medal count. The most successful

nation in Winter Olympics history with 405 total medals (148 gold) since 1924, Norway has dominated in sports such as cross-country skiing, biathlon, ski jumping and Nordic combined due to a love for winter activities and a strong culture of fun participation at an early age. Norwegians have also excelled in speed skating, alpine skiing and curling.

Norway plans to send 80 athletes this year to compete. Top names feature cross-country skiers Heidi Weng, Kristine Stavås Skistad and Johannes Høstflot Klæbo, who already has five Olympic gold medals (7 total); biathlete Sturla Holm Lægreid; snowboarder Marcus Kleveland; curlers Kristin Skaslien and Martin Nedregotten, who compete in mixed doubles; and speed skater Sander Eitrem, who just broke the men's 5,000 world record.

Ski jumpers Marius Lindvik and Johann André Forfang will also attend. Both are previous medalists but they just completed three-month suspensions for unknowingly wearing illegally altered jumping suits. In the embarrassing, suit-tampering scandal two Norwegian team coaches and a staff member have been banned for 18 months, including this Winter Olympics.
